

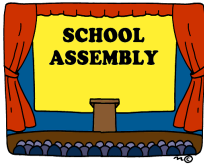

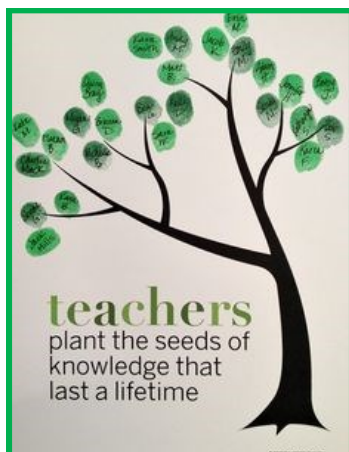
ATTENDANCE NOTE PAD
