The 5-7 program is for children who are turning 6 or 7 in 2016. The program consists of skills and activities on Thursday afternoons from 4-4.45pm.

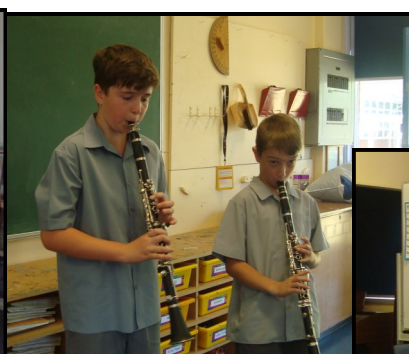
