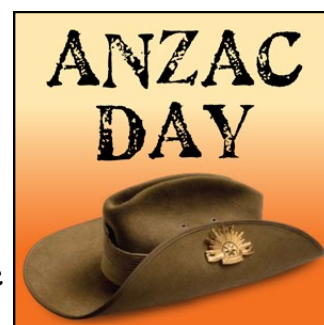
Parent Survey

ALBURY/WODONGA EISTEDDFOD ENTRIES

As Term One of 2016 draws to a close it is time to plan for the Albury/Wodonga Eisteddfod. It is not compulsory for speech students to enter the competition, but for those who would like to do so entries need to be in by May 6th. The entry fees must also be paid by this date. Parents and/or Guardians are responsible for getting their child/children to the venue for the appropriate session.

Details are available on line, and the age of competitors is taken on July 1st, 2016. For those who have not competed in Eisteddfods before it is often easier if they do a Duologue. This is where two competitors present a short play or skit and they have the advantage of working with a friend. In this section it is important for them to be sure of their lines so they don't let their partner down. Prepared reading is also a good starting point as they have their book and don't have the fear of forgetting their words.

Mime is appealing to many young people, as some have played at this since they were small.

However this is quite a technical section in eisteddfod, and entry is not recommended until several techniques have been mastered.

For those who have not won a gold medal in an individual section at a previous Albury festival there is a Novice Section for 10 years and under and also for 12 years and under. For those in the 12 years and under the Own Choice selection must not be Light or Humorous, but may be for the 10 years and under competitors.

I am happy to help with or even make entries for my students. You are welcome to phone me on 0427 889 599 preferably after 8.00pm. if you would like me to do this or if you would like to discuss any details.

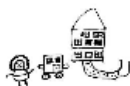
