Thank you to whole school community for a supportive first week. I am enjoying the opportunity to talk with different people. I had some interesting conversations with some students last week. I have discovered a great deal of information about them. A lot of the time our children are quick to label themselves - both positive and negative. It follows on from some terrific professional learning the staff took part in about fixed vs growth mindsets. What I can tell you is labelling kids, positively or negatively, only causes harm.

Children are so impressionable. We often praise the end result, rather than the process of getting there. "You must be really smart" isn't as effective as, "That must have taken a great deal of practice!" I'd love you to pose the question to your children at home and just listen to the words they say. You'll get a really clear picture of how they see themselves. Self-awareness or understanding self is the NUMBER 1 factor regarding ability to learn.

The more we can shape their view of themselves by giving feedback on their effort rather than end result will only prove to be of significant benefit!

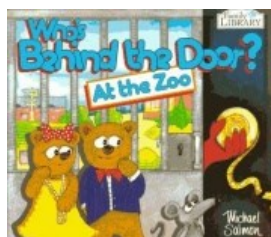
MICHAEL SALMON **Author/Illustrator** **Visit**

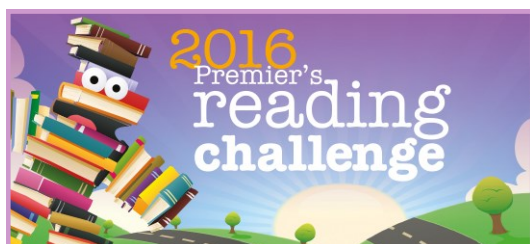
