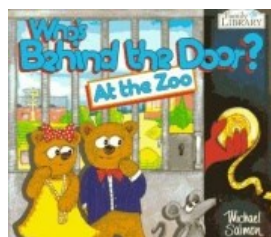
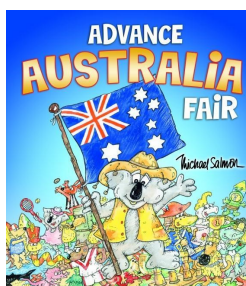
Michael will be visiting the school on Wednesday 10th August from 10.30am to 11.30am.
