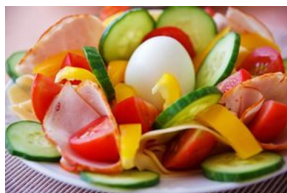

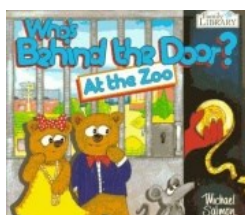
Michael will be visiting the school on Wednesday 10th August from 10.30am to 11.30am.

He will be speaking to all the students as well as be available for book signings.

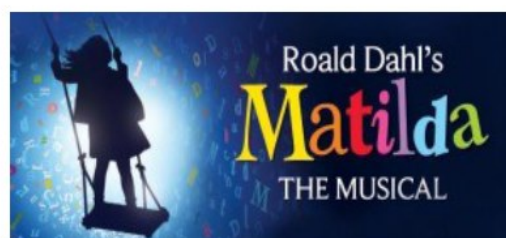
He has written & illustrated many children's books that are a delight to read.
